Rose Garden Fountain Bricks

Honor special friends or family members, memorialize loved ones, celebrate anniversaries, birthdays or holidays or recognize generous acts of kindness by purchasing an inscribed brick. The brick will be placed in a rose formation surrounding the fountain in the formal area of the garden. There are only a limited number of bricks available.

Two sizes are available:

For a \$250 or \$750 contribution, you can have a brick inscribed and placed in the renovated garden. Each brick allows for 2 lines of text, with 16 characters per line.

The public rose gardens at Antelope Park include both a formal display garden of cutting roses and an informal strolling garden with hardy landscape roses with perennials and ornamental grasses. The garden features more than 1,500 roses, updated furnishings and ornamental lighting, a fountain, original sculptures and a pavilion at the south entrance.

In 2006, the formal garden was renamed the Hamann Rose Garden in honor of local businessman Don Hamann, who made a generous gift to renovate the garden. The renovation campaign was led by the Lincoln Parks Foundation with help from the Lincoln Rose Society.

You can help support the public rose gardens by purchasing a tribute brick or bed of roses or volunteering your time to keep the gardens beautiful.



Bed of Roses

Over 100 varieties of roses are displayed in distinct, individual beds available for sponsorship. Each sponsored bed will be distinguished by an inscribed tile with the donor's choice of wording.

A contribution of \$1500 is accepted for a Bed of Roses. The tile allows for 4 lines of text, with 16 characters per line.



Garden Gab

We invite you to be part of Garden Gab, a new “learn and do” program at Lincoln’s public display gardens at Sunken Gardens and Antelope Park. Garden Gab sessions are offered at 9 a.m. Tuesday and Thursday mornings through the growing season.

Each Garden Gab session begins at the Rotary Pavilion in the Sunken Gardens (across the street west from gardens at Antelope Park).
