

RESOLUTION NO. A- _____

1 WHEREAS, the citizens of the City of Lincoln, Nebraska, are proud of the choice made
2 to operate a community-owned, non-profit electric utility and, because of that choice, are both
3 customers and owners of the Lincoln Electric System (LES); and

4 WHEREAS, LES provides homes, businesses, farms, social service and government
5 agencies with reliable, efficient, and cost-effective electricity, employing sound business
6 practices designed to ensure the best possible service at the lowest possible rates, with direct
7 local control of present and future electric energy resources; and

8 WHEREAS, public ownership of LES assures cost-based, non-profit electric rates and
9 local control of electric utility operations and policies; and

10 WHEREAS, nationwide surveys show electric energy costs in Lincoln are generally in
11 the lowest 10 percent of the nation, and LES continually demonstrates responsiveness to
12 customer-owners and community needs through energy audits, energy conservation
13 assistance, customer assistance, and commitment to the environment through its Renewable
14 Energy Program; and

15 WHEREAS, LES is one of a community of over 2,000 public-owned electric utilities in
16 the United States, ensuring competition in the electric utility industry and benefiting all
17 electric customers.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Lincoln,
19 Nebraska:

20 That the week of October 1-7, 2000 be designated Public Power Week in Lincoln,
21 Nebraska, in order to honor LES, its employees, and its customer-owners, who work together
22 to provide the best possible electric service; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Lincoln City Council joins the LES Administrative
2 Board and all publicly-owned electric utilities in Nebraska and throughout the nation in
3 celebrating the public benefits of public power.
