Dick Noble has been general manager of KZUM for more than eight years. In that time, Nebraska's original community radio station has experienced considerable financial growth and has become deeply involved in community outreach.

The station now produces and broadcasts programs in seven languages, hosts an annual cultural awareness awards presentation, produces the KZUM Member's Choice Music Awards to honor local musicians, and conducts broadcast training for selected elementary and middle school students.

Mr. Noble came to KZUM following an extensive and varied media career which spans five decades.

He started as a television performer in New York before his 10th birthday and made the transition to radio as a teenager. He has managed several radio and television operations, owned broadcast properties in New England, taught broadcast management in the United States, Europe, and Asia, and served as the director of broadcast training for the United States Navy.

He studied radio and television at Butler University and is a Distinguished Honor Graduate of the Defense Information School.

His career has taken him virtually around the world with stints in Europe and Cuba as well as some work with Dick Clark Productions. He was radio host for the 1970 Bob Hope USO Worldwide Christmas Show.

Mr. Noble was elected recently to his third successive term as Chairman of the Board for the National Federation of Community Broadcasters (NFCB).

NFCB is comprised of public radio stations across the United States including major markets like New York City and Los Angeles as well as small reservation stations operated by Native American broadcasters.

He and his wife, Donnette, and their children live in Lincoln.
