

### **DIRECTED POLICY RESEARCH PROJECTS (1998-2002)**

- Community by Design*. Thirty minute documentary, funded by Nebraska Educational Telecommunications in Higher Education (NETCHE). The documentary examines the effect of the built environment on social capital, civic engagement, and community capacity building using extensive footage of neighborhoods and interviews with their residents along with interviews of local, state, and national planners and scholars. The documentary demonstrates that certain built environment features of neighborhoods serve to strengthen social interaction and, consequently,

civic engagement and political behavior. The key is the type of social capital being created in neighborhoods where, conceptually, social capital arises out of strong ties and *weak bridging ties*. It is the *bridging ties* that serve community building, not the strong ties or weak ties of few degrees, and it is this concept that serves as the analytical foundation to the project. The documentary was aired on NETV Summer 2002 and subsequently distributed nationwide to PBS stations.

Nebraska Health and Human Services. "Promoting Special Needs Adoption." Research of other states and non-profit agencies adoption campaigns and promotions lead to recommendations for how to design a website, and publicize and create an educational campaign for special needs adoption.

Lincoln/Lancaster County Habitat for Humanity. In organizational disarray and facing the loss of federal funding and national affiliation, the local chapter's Board and Director commissioned a study of their organization to identify the problems, determine the causes of the problems, and find realistic solutions for both the short and long-term viability.

Citizens Against Racism and Discrimination (CARD). A local non-profit group formed in 1990 as an organized response to counter the racist public statements, CARD commissioned a study to evaluate the effectiveness of their efforts as well as assess the viability of the group's long and short term goals. Recommendations included methods to obtain higher visibility and the identification of testable measures for monitoring community progress on racism.

Drought Mitigation Center. Farmers' perceptions of and preparation for drought vulnerability were assessed. These results were then compared to a study done four years ago that used only environmental factors to construct drought vulnerability areas. The social perception and behavior data found a number of extremely important factors previously overlooked, which will be used by the DMC to construct better data collection for developing drought vulnerability maps as well as create better educational extension information.

Genetic Testing Anti-Discrimination Policies: Commissioned by Senator Pam Brown, Nebraska Unicameral Legislature, to examine the impact of genetic testing legislation on affected communities (insurance companies, employers, doctors, and people who have the tests done). A comparative state analysis was done. The results were used by the Senator to prepare a comprehensive bill on genetic testing, submitted in the 2001 session.

Lincoln Action Program: "Juvenile Restorative Justice Program." Program evaluation of phase I, a six-week intensive immersion program for selected juvenile offenders. Various activities were assessed as well as the overall impact.

Nebraska Regional Health Centers: "Transition of Nebraska's Regional Mental Health Centers." Impact evaluation of the legislative initiative for behavioral health redesign plan, which included closing several satellite centers and placing clients in halfway homes.

Nebraska State Court System: "Terminating Parental Rights." Projection assessment of juvenile court readiness to implement a new law to streamline the process for terminating parental rights. Report recommendations included the need for more comprehensive information packets and educational workshops for judges. Research was done for the *Center for Children, Families and the Law*.

Lincoln Public Libraries: "Heritage Room Collection." Assessment of current practices and recommendations for implementing standards by which to evaluate and select literary work from

Nebraska authors.

Lincoln Mediation Center: "Development Pressures and the Mediation Process." Analysis of the city council appointed Lincoln Mediation Center's efforts to respond to and resolve citizen opposition to development at the edge of Wilderness Park.
