Dear Local Governing Body:

Attached is the form to be used on all retail liquor license applications. Local clerks must collect proper license fees and occupation tax per ordinance, if any, before delivering the license at time of issuance.

TWO KEY TIME FRAMES TO KEEP IN MIND ARE:

- 1) You have 45 days to conduct a hearing after the date of receipt of the notice from this Commission (§53-134). You may choose **NOT** to make a recommendation of approval or denial to our Commission.

PER §53-133, THE LIQUOR CONTROL COMMISSION SHALL SET FOR HEARING ANY APPLICATION WHEREIN:

- 1) There is a recommendation of denial from the local governing body.
- 2) A citizens protest; or
- 3) Statutory problems that the Commission discovers.

PLEASE NOTE...A LICENSEE MUST BE "PROPERLY" LICENSED IN ORDER TO PURCHASE FROM WHOLESALERS; AND, A LICENSE IS EFFECTIVE:

- 1) Upon payment of the license fees;
- 2) Physical possession of the license;
- 3) Effective date on the license.

A Catering License allows a Retail Class C, D, I or L license to deliver, sell or dispense alcoholic liquors, including beer, for consumption at a location designated on a Special Designated License. The Catering License is renewed in the same manner as the Retail License held by the Licensee. A Licensee shall not cater an event unless a Special Designated License has been obtained. An application seeking a Special Designated License must be filed with the local governing body at least 21 days prior to the event which is to be catered. The application may then be filed with the Commission, along with the local approval. The \$25.00 per day license fee for Special Designated License is not required for the holder of a Catering License and the number of days allowed are unlimited.



A copy of your application for a Catering License will be forwarded to the local governing body for recommendation. Per 53-133, the Liquor Commission shall set for hearing any application receiving local denial, a citizens protest or having statutory problems discovered by the Commission. If the local governing body does not make a recommendation, the Commission may approve or deny the issuance of a license. Catering licenses shall be delivered to the licensee in the same manner as provided in subsection (4) of Sec. 53-132 for delivery of licenses.
