REASON FOR LEGISLATION: The natural resources of the area, inherent beauty, proximity to large metropolitan centers, good transportation, numerous recreation and tourist destinations, and desirability for residential and commercial development all provide the setting for unprecedented growth and development both now and into the future. The Cumulative Impact Study (CIS) project, a geographically-based project, seeks to manage and protect the unique and valuable Lower Platte River Corridor ecosystem by collecting and organizing the necessary data and information to evaluate ecosystem and land use changes over time.

DISCUSSION

This Agreement is between the City of Lincoln, MUD, LPSNRD, LPNNRD, NDOR, and PMRNRD. It would be a multi year contract. The Lincoln Water System and MUD own and operate water collection, treatment and distribution systems located within the Lower Platte River Corridor. Development within the Lower Platte River Corridor will impact the water supply. The Lower Platte South NRD will be the lead agency. The contributions to this project involve Federal revenues (US Army Corps of Engineers and USGS) of \$167,500. The total local revenues are \$167,500. The City of Lincoln contribution is \$15,000.
