21 EDUCATIONAL ACCESS TO AIR LONDON PARADE FEATURING LINCOLN SOUTHWEST HIGH SCHOOL BAND

When the Lincoln Southwest High School marching band is parading through the streets of London, England New Year's Day, family and friends back home will be able to watch it live on 21 Educational Access (Time Warner Cable channel 21 in Lincoln). The 24th annual parade will be sent via satellite beginning at 6 a.m., Friday, January 1, 2009. The parade will be re-aired on channel 21 numerous times during the month of January.

Bill Luxford, operations manager for 21 Educational Access and 5 CITY-TV, said the channel carried the Lincoln Southwest High performance at the same parade four years ago, the Lincoln High performance two years ago, and the Lincoln East performance last year. He said Nebraska Educational Telecommunications (NET) is again helping with the satellite feed.

Southwest High Band Director Terry Rush said 155 students will march in the parade, and 47 others will accompany the band on the week-long trip.

"Marching in the New Year's Day Parade is a great honor for our students," Rush said. "We are honored to be representatives of Lincoln Southwest High School as well as Lincoln Public Schools, Lincoln, Nebraska and the United States. The London New Year's Day Parade has become the largest parade in the world with over 40 countries from around the world participating."

Students in the school's Wind Ensemble, Chamber Choir and Chamber Orchestra also will perform at one of London's largest cathedrals. In addition to the performances, students will have the opportunity to tour many of the historical aspects of London including museums, the Tower of London and Windsor Castle along with the City of Bath and Stonehenge.

The parade features more than 8,500 performers, and about 550,000 spectators turn out in London to watch. The parade route includes such landmarks as the Parliament building, Westminster Abbey, 10 Downing Street and the National Gallery.

A power surge damaged the Internet communication equipment and servers at Lincoln City Libraries, and library service will be impacted through early next week.

Items previously checked out cannot be renewed, but any late fees that accumulate due to the current interruption will be waived.

Other services that are temporarily unavailable include Internet through Wi Fi or computer labs, placement of holds, courtesy notices, downloadable audio books and access to data bases.

“Library staff and contractors are working diligently to repair equipment as quickly as possible,” said Library Director Pat Leach. “We realize this is a major inconvenience to our customers and thank them for their patience.”

LINCOLN HOME OWNERS TO SEE FLOOD INSURANCE SAVINGS

Mayor Chris Beutler announced today that Lincoln homeowners who buy flood insurance will see their premiums further reduced by the City's recent upgrading in the federal Community Rating System. The 2,000-plus policy holders in Lincoln will now save an average of \$160 a year through the City's participation in the rating system program, a total of more than \$320,000 City-wide.

"The Community Rating System rewards cities like Lincoln for taking extra steps to protect residents from floods," Mayor Beutler said. "Lincoln is one of only three cities in Nebraska to take advantage of the program. Our City has a better rating and receives a greater premium reduction than 95 percent of the more than 1,200 cities nationwide that participate."

The Mayor commended the Building and Safety Department and the Watershed Management Division of the Public Works and Utilities Department for their work with the Community Rating System. The program, administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), provides lower premiums for property owners who have flood insurance through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) and are located in a participating city.

Lincoln has been active in the Community Rating System since October 1991. A City's rating is based on activities in four areas – public information, mapping and regulations, flood damage reduction and flood preparedness. "Even those without property in the floodplain benefit from this program," Beutler said. "These floodplain management practices save lives, protect the environment and prevent damage to private property and public infrastructure."

A major reason for the City's upgrade from class 7 to class 6 was the City's work with FEMA to take into account the protection that the Salt Creek levee provides for smaller, more frequent flood events. The class 6 rating provides for a 20-percent premium reduction for those policy holders who have structures in the floodplain, five percent more than the class 7 rating.

The NFIP provides federally backed flood insurance for communities that enact and enforce floodplain regulations. The three goals of the Community Rating System are to reduce flood losses, facilitate accurate insurance ratings and promote awareness of flood insurance.

MAYOR ENCOURAGES RESIDENTS TO REPORT POTHOLES

Mayor Chris Beutler said all City street maintenance staff not working on snow removal will now be working to fill potholes. Arterial streets will be the first priority. The Mayor encourages residents to report potholes created by the recent weather. Potholes are created when water seeps into cracks in the pavement, freezes and expands.

Citizens can report potholes and other non-emergency street problems in three ways:

- Call the Pothole Hotline at 441-7646.
- Call the Street Maintenance Division of Public Works and Utilities at 441-7701. Street problems requiring immediate action should be reported to this number.
- Use the online form available on the home page of the City Web site, lincoln.ne.gov, under the heading Citizen Action Center (selected "Street - Pothole"). This form also may also be used to report stormwater, snow and ice problems.

City crews today are checking on problem areas, responding to complaints and working on complete snow removal operations on arterials. Motorists are asked to be aware that re-freezing at night can create icy street conditions. Drivers also are encouraged to be especially careful as they drive around crews performing street repairs.

Lincoln continues to be on the cutting edge in keeping our streets safe during winter storms. Attached is a USA Today article outlining what other cities and states are doing.


As you know, we do use the salt brine as a pre-treatment.

While we don't use fluid from sugar beets like Maryland does, we do use a mixture that includes a corn byproduct for pre-treating brand new concrete surfaces. It's also sprayed onto rock salt to enhance the salt's melting capabilities when pavement temperatures drop below 20 degrees.

Finally, the article mentions Nevada's use of pavement sensors. We also use sensors in some locations.

A snow emergency remains in effect for the City of Lincoln. That means parking is banned on emergency snow routes, bus routes and other major arterial streets. Mayor Chris Beutler has announced that the snow emergency parking ban will be lifted at 6 p.m. Saturday evening. Where allowed, parking will again be available on major streets and bus routes after this time.





3. Does the \$1.1 million for the two restaurants include the amount paid to Monte Froehlich?
4. What is the square footage of the restaurants in the existing Carper Building (Chipotle and Valentino's)?
5. How much square footage is estimated to be used on the first floor/ground floor, to accommodate parking ramps and pay stations and any other logistical facility?
 - a. Would this be approximately 22,000 SF, leaving 20,000 SF for the other ground level commercial space?
6. You mentioned there will be approximately \$3.1 million in soft costs. What comprises these soft costs?
 - a. The developers are estimating expenditure of \$15.8 million with \$11.2 million "hard construction".
 - b. Does that mean the remaining \$4.6 million will be "soft costs"?
 - c. Please define applications of the \$4.6 million
7. Will CVS Pharmacy be part of this project?

8. TIF: You mentioned the usual "standard categories" for use of TIF monies. Would you please "prioritize" this list and itemize the allocation of the anticipated \$1.5 million TIF to each category, in order of priority?

9. When will your economic analysis be distributed to the City Council?

10. What timelines are being required of the developers to start and complete this project?

a. If performance is not done on a timely basis, what are the consequences?

11. The total cost is projected to be \$27.1 million, but NOT including costs for public improvements like utilities, public plaza, and public right-of-way.

a. What are these additional costs estimated to total?

b. What is the source for these funds?

12. You noted TIF \$1.5 is not part of the \$27.1 million.

a. Will the developer use the TIF as part of its contribution?

b. Or, if TIF is not part of the \$27.1 million, does that mean the project overall costs can be defined as follows:

- 1) \$27.1 million
- 2) \$4.5 million--City's previous acquisition of land
- 3) Unknown amount for lost tax revenue these past several years
- 4) \$1.5 million TIF
- 5) Costs for public improvements-utilities-plaza-public right-of-way

c. I am trying to understand the "total" amount estimated to be expended for this project and to quantify the City's public dollars portion.

General information about the American Temperament Test Society, Inc. (ATTS)

The American Temperament Test Society, Inc. (ATTS) is a national not-for-profit organization (registered in the state of Missouri) for the promotion of uniform temperament evaluation of purebred and spayed/neutered mixed-breed dogs.

ATTS was established to:

- Provide for a uniform national program of temperament testing of purebred and spayed/neutered mixed-breed dogs.
- Conduct seminars to disseminate information to dog owners, dog breeders and evaluators (testers) concerning dog psychology, motivation, reaction and other aspects of temperament testing.
- Recognize and award certificates to dogs that pass the requirements of the temperament evaluation.
- Work for the betterment of all breeds of dogs.
- Select, train, prepare and register temperament evaluators.

Our motto says all:

"A SOUND MIND IN A SOUND BODY"

ATTS is the only non-profit organization that gives the TT (Temperament Tested) title for a dog. The TT, our logo and test procedures are copyrighted. The test is for all breeds and it is uniform throughout the country.

ATTS was founded by Alfons Ertel in 1977. The first test was held in September 1977; ATTS has held more than 960 tests as of December 31, 2003. The number of dogs tested as of December 2007 is 28,010 with 22,847 dogs earning a TT title. The average overall pass rate is 81.6 percent; the pass rate may vary for different breeds. The breed's temperament, training, health and age of the dog is taken into account. Minimum age for dogs to take the test is 18 months.

The test takes about 12 minutes to complete. The dog is on a loose six-foot (6') lead and three ATTS trained evaluators score the dog. Majority rules. Failure on any part of the test is recognized when a dog shows panic, strong avoidance without recovery or unprovoked aggression.

National breed clubs can request the list of their breed which earned the TT for the previous year by sending a request accompanied by a self addressed stamped envelope. A request for a complete list of all dogs of any one breed which have earned a TT is available, but breeds which have more than five pages of dogs will need to cover the cost of copying and postage.
