LMC 6.08.060 - License Fees

- a. Unaltered Dogs \$50.00.....current fee \$34.00
- b. Altered Dogs \$19.00.....current fee \$17.00
- c. Unaltered Cats \$36.00.....current fee \$34.00
- d. Altered Cats \$19.00.....current fee \$17.00
- e. Senior Citizens
 - i. Unaltered dogs and cats \$30.00.....current fee \$28.00
 - ii. Altered dogs and cats \$16.00.....current fee \$14.00

The fee increase that was initially proposed would have only been for unaltered dogs. Due to a change in State law this year (LB910) which requires the Health Department to collect an additional \$1.00 fee on all (dog and cat) licenses sold, there are proposed increases in other license fees. The new law would require the State to keep \$.97 cents of the dollar and we would get \$.03. We are proposing a \$2.00 increase which would cover the implementation costs and delay any need to increase fees in the near future.

A total of 36,608 (83%) of the dog licenses sold are for altered dogs. 6,320 (17%) are unaltered dogs.

There are several clean up provisions proposed in Chapter 6.08, many of which eliminate duplicate provisions in Chapter 6.04.
