<p>The proposed resolution approves a public art master plan for works of art to be placed on city-owned property, City of Lincoln Public Art Master Plan, pursuant to Lincoln Municipal Code Section 14.56.130 Master Plan Review; Mayor. LMC section 14.56.130 states that the Mayor shall develop one or more master plans for public art to be submitted to the City Council for approval. Each public art master plan is to be reviewed by the Mayor at least one time during each elected term of office.
