REASON FOR LEGISLATION: To provide authority for the Mayor to execute a Programming Agreement between the City of Lincoln and the State of Nebraska Department of Roads, to allow the use of Federal Surface Transportation Program Funds for construction and construction engineering of the 70th Street, Van Dorn to Eastborough Concrete Pavement Repair project.

DISCUSSION

The City of Lincoln Public Works & Utilities proposes to repair or replace deteriorated concrete panels and joints along approximately 2.2 miles of 70th Street from Van Dorn to Eastborough. The project will also include replacement of curb ramps that do not meet ADA standards. Construction is anticipated to begin in 2015, assuming right of way or easements will not be necessary to acquire. This schedule is also dependent upon the Federal Aid process that will need to be followed with the Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). The agreement also describes the process and procedures the project will follow, contains provisions for the project to be let by NDOR, and includes language to describe duties and assurances of the Responsible Charge (RC) person.

The construction and construction engineering will be partially funded (80%) by Federal Surface Transportation Program funds currently estimated to be \$2,428,000. The City will pay 100% of the preliminary engineering costs and 20% of the construction and construction engineering costs, currently estimated to be \$737,000 total.
