## Resume for Lloyd D. Hinkley

I was born in South Dakota in 1929 and moved to Lincoln at age 5. I graduated from Northeast High School and earned my Bachelor's Degree from the University of Nebraska with a major in Business Administration. I am a Korean War Veteran, discharged in March of 1953. I was licensed as a Real Estate Broker in 1954. I was elected to the Lincoln City Council in 1961 and served two terms. I was appointed to the Lincoln Housing Authority in 1970 and served until 1980. I was appointed by the Governor to the Nebraska Real Estate Commission and served seven and a half years. In 1992, I was appointed by the Governor to a five year term on the Real Estate Appraisal Board. I have received many honors in my profession including Realtor of the Year for the State of Nebraska in 1972 and Realtor of the Year in 2007 by the Realtor Association of Lincoln. I have served on many city and county committees and commissions. In 1987, I served a three year term on the Lincoln Hospital Association Board. I was appointed in 1994 by the City County Common to the Master Plan Review Committee. In 1996, I was appointed by the Mayor to the Mayor's Advisory Committee on Hospital Alternatives. Also in 1996, I was appointed to the Congestion Management Task Force. I was appointed to the Charter Revision Committee in 2003 and served until 2007.
