

**STATE OF NEBRASKA AND CITY OF LINCOLN OFFICIALS ANNOUNCE
A MAJOR NEW OFFICE FACILITY AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA
TECHNOLOGY PARK***FORTUNE 1,000 GLOBAL COMPANY PLANS TO CREATE UP TO 150 NEW TECHNOLOGY JOBS
AND OCCUPY 150,000 SQUARE-FOOT OFFICE BUILDING IN LINCOLN*

Lincoln, Neb. – Nebraska Governor Dave Heineman and Lincoln Mayor Chris Beutler announced the planned construction of a 150,000 square foot office building on 21 acres at the University of Nebraska Technology Park. The building will be the new home for Lincoln-based employees of Perot Systems Corporation, a worldwide provider of information technology services and business solutions. The company will house the majority of its current Lincoln workforce, which totals around 1,000 associates, in the new facility and will begin to hire additional employees for up to 150 new high tech positions in Lincoln. The estimated \$23 million construction project, which is subject to tax increment financing approval by the Lincoln City Council, will make Lincoln one of Perot Systems' largest U.S. employment locations.

Perot Systems' Lincoln operations provide technology and business process support to the life insurance and annuity industry. Most of the company's employees in Lincoln were formerly part of TAG/TMI, a company Perot Systems acquired in 2005. The University of Nebraska Technology Park facility will allow most of those individuals to relocate to one building.

"When we began looking for a way to bring our team together in one location, the University of Nebraska Technology Park proved to be the best fit, allowing us to strengthen our presence in Lincoln while also providing the required space for new job creation," said Mike Kerrey, Executive Vice President of Insurance and Business Process Solutions at Perot Systems. "Pending the necessary approvals, we are excited about making the Technology Park our new home and are grateful to the City of Lincoln, University of Nebraska Technology Park, the Lincoln Partnership for Economic Development and the State of Nebraska for their positive support and tireless efforts in making Lincoln an attractive, positive location to expand the company's home here."

According to Kerrey, Perot Systems will also establish a service delivery center at the facility, expanding its growing Infrastructure Solutions (IS) unit into Lincoln and creating 150 new technical job opportunities. These positions will be in systems engineering and administration, utilizing technologies such as UNIX, Intel, messaging, storage, mainframe and network management.

Governor Dave Heineman said, "The jobs being created by Perot Systems in the coming years are exactly the kind of high-tech jobs we are trying to attract to Nebraska. This announcement presents a great opportunity to encourage more of our best and brightest students and professionals to remain in the state."

Lincoln Mayor Chris Beutler said the announcement by Perot Systems is another indication that Lincoln can compete for new jobs and economic development growth from the nation's top employers.

"Retaining and creating quality jobs is a high priority for Lincoln and the State of Nebraska," Mayor Beutler said. "This project is a good example of how the partnership between the City of Lincoln, Lincoln Partnership for Economic Development, Nebraska Department of Economic Development, and University of Nebraska Technology Park can play a significant role in maintaining the economic vitality of our community."

Lincoln Chamber of Commerce President Wendy Birdsall said the Lincoln Partnership for Economic Development (LPED) was pleased to play an important support role with Perot Systems, and sees this as another important step in expanding Lincoln's technology expertise.

"Perot Systems evaluated a number of options before deciding to continue its growth in Lincoln," Birdsall said. "This is exciting news as it validates Lincoln as a destination for major corporate investment and technology employment. The Partnership and Chamber are thrilled to be part of such a great project."

Final approval of TIF financing is expected to be ready for Lincoln City Council action in mid-August, and it is anticipated that construction on the new office building could begin in the third quarter of 2008.

The University of Nebraska Technology Park is a cooperative partnership of the University of Nebraska Foundation, University of Nebraska and private sector investors. Founded in 1996, the Technology Park is home to 18 companies and organizations employing approximately 1,000 people. The park provides services for start-up and established companies including on-site expansion and building options.
