BIOBLITZ

Mark your calendars for the first ever Pioneers Park Nature Center Prairie/Prairie Pond BioBlitz on August 12th and 13th! We will have fun while we survey the biodiversity of approximately 200 acres of tall grass prairie at the park. Volunteers will team up with scientists to identify plants and animals with the goal of taking a "snapshot" inventory and creating species lists for grasses, flowers, shrubs, mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians, insects, and other invertebrates that call our prairie home. We'll begin at 7:00 p.m. on Friday August 12th and wrap things up by 3:00 p.m. the following day. A schedule of when various surveys will be held will be available. Participants can come for one or more surveys, and can bring camping gear for an overnight stay. An evening snack, breakfast and lunch will be provided for those who sign up. There are no expertise requirements; anyone who likes to wander several miles through the prairie with their eyes wide open is welcome.
