About our presenter, Lori Seibel:

Inspired by a strong belief that “place matters,” the Community Health Endowment of Lincoln (CHE) undertook a mapping project to better understand the role of place in health status and behaviors in Lincoln. By mapping factors such as poverty, crime, access to care, childhood obesity and many more, these maps tell powerful stories about our community. Lori Seibel, President/CEO of CHE, will help us become acquainted with our community in a new way by using maps to help us navigate our way to a healthier community.

CHE was created in 1998 from the proceeds of the sale of Lincoln General Hospital. Since then, CHE has returned more than \$23 million to the community to support health-related programs and projects. Of particular interest to CHE are creating a strong healthcare safety net, integrating primary care and mental health services, reducing obesity, developing diverse leadership among local non-profit boards and commissions, and minimizing adverse childhood experiences and toxic stress. CHE believes that Lincoln can become the healthiest community in the nation through energetic partnerships, creative solutions, and imaginative philanthropy.

Prior to joining CHE, Lori was the city’s Epidemiologist and an assistant to two Lincoln Mayors. She is a graduate of Peru State College and the University of Wisconsin-Madison. She lives in Lincoln with her husband Bryan and two children.
