Alvin Saunders Johnson

Homer

Son of immigrant Nebraska farmers, graduate of and teacher at NU. Earned PhD at Columbia in 1902. Adult education innovator. Directed New School in New York City, where he sheltered Jewish scholars fleeing Nazism. Authored model anti-discrimination law.

Bess Streeter Aldrich

Elmwood and Lincoln

Prolific Nebraska author who gave literary life to Midwestern pioneer history, emphasizing the importance of family and perseverance, which her own life demonstrated. Author of a dozen books and more than 100 short stories from the 1910s to 1950s.

Charlie and Suzy Wright

Lincoln

Recognizing and respecting Native American history to honor the First People of the Plains.

Edward J. Flanagan

Boys Town

Priest, social reformer and visionary who benefitted children and families immeasurably. Pioneered efforts to save children from neglect, abuse and poverty, founding Boys Town in 1917. He declared "There's no such thing as a bad boy."

Lincoln

Wed in 1947, attorney Jack was a civic leader, Jo loved and supported the arts. They had three children.

Lincoln

Wed in 1919, Don was a lawyer and Laura was a civic leader, chairing the YWCA. They had three sons.

Mr. & Mrs. C. Radcliffe

Sidney

Wed in 1918. Clayton was a lawyer, stock man and cowboy historian. The parents of C.S. & Myrna were early pioneers.

Hebron

This fourth generation Nebraskan graduated from NU in 1965 with degrees in chemistry and zoology. After a career in investment banking he made legacy gifts to UNL Glenn Korff School of Music, the Lied Center Broadway Series and to this Mall.

John Neihardt

Wayne and Bancroft

Epic poet of the West, historian, philosopher and friend of the American Indian. Nebraska Poet Laureate in Perpetuity, 1921 to 1973. Wrote *Black Elk Speaks* (1932). Married sculptress Mona (Martinsen) Neihardt in 1910. They had four children.

Jack McBride

Omaha and Lincoln

Visionary pioneer in public broadcasting, he began at NU in 1953 as the first director of educational TV. He founded KUON in 1954, which grew into the statewide NET network under his leadership. Played a key role in founding PBS, and advised 25 nations.

Junior League of Lincoln

Lincoln

Established in 1921 by women of Lincoln to improve the lives of women and children through education and philanthropy. The volunteers of Junior League train leaders, raise funds, advocate, laugh and develop lifelong friendships.

Mari Sandoz

Gordon and Lincoln

Born in 1896 south of Hays Springs, eldest of six children. Author, teacher and friend of the Native American, her books include *Old Jules*, *Slogum House* and *Crazy Horse*. "The real frontier lies in the stimulation of the creative mind of man."

NEBRASKAland Foundation

Begun in 1962 to promote the unique cultural heritage of our state and recognize outstanding Nebraskans.

Susette La Flesche Tibbles

Omaha Reservation

Known as "Bright Eyes" to her Omaha tribe, Tibbles was a teacher, journalist and speaker. She interpreted for Chief Standing Bear during his historic civil rights trial in 1879. She later toured the U.S. and abroad as an advocate for Native American rights.

Willa Cather

Red Cloud

Born in Virginia, raised in Red Cloud and graduated from the University of Nebraska. Journalist, teacher, poet and novelist of frontier life including *O Pioneers!* and *My Antonia*. 1923 Pulitzer Prize winner for *One of Ours*.

William Frederick Cody

North Platte

Born in 1846, Buffalo Bill was an Army scout, buffalo hunter, rancher, irrigationist, and showman of the West. In 1883 Cody founded his Wild West show that toured the world romanticizing the American West and the cowboy.
