

Information About The  
**2008 Annexation Study**

The City of Lincoln has completed the 2008 Annexation Study and has identified 14 adjacent areas for potential annexation into the City of Lincoln. This proposal will raise many questions for property owners, so the City is not scheduling this item before the City Council until 2009 to allow adequate time to answer questions.

Property owners are invited to attend a public informational meeting on either:

**NORTH**

**Thursday, September 25, 2008**, from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. at the Eiseley Library, 1530 Superior Street. There will be a presentation at 5:30 p.m. that will provide an overview of the annexation study, as well as an opportunity to ask questions of staff. The focus of the meeting is on the proposed annexations north of A Street, but anyone may attend.

**Thursday, October 2, 2008**, from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. at Scott Middle School, 2200 Pine Lake Road (in the cafeteria on the east side closest to Ridge Road). There will be a presentation at 5:30 p.m. that will provide an overview of the annexation study, as well as an opportunity to ask questions of staff. The focus of the meeting is on the proposed annexations south of A Street, but anyone may attend.

**SOUTH**

It is anticipated that the presentation will take less than 30 minutes. Staff will be available to answer questions before and after the presentation until 7:00 p.m. Staff from the Public Works and Utilities Department, Planning Department and Health Department are scheduled to attend.
