CHARTER REVISION COMMISSION

4.04.010 Charter Revision Commission Established; Membership.

There is hereby created and established a fifteen-member advisory commission to be known as the Lincoln Charter Revision Commission. The members of this commission shall be appointed by the Mayor, subject to approval by the City Council. The initial terms of members appointed to the commission shall be staggered so that three members are appointed for a one-year term, four members are appointed for a two-year term, four members are appointed for a three-year term, and four members are appointed for a four-year term. Thereafter, all members of the commission shall be appointed for a four-year term. In making appointments to the commission, the Mayor shall attempt to achieve a balanced commission membership which shall be a reasonable representative cross-section of the residents of the city, both geographically and socio-economically. The City Attorney shall be an ex officio member of the commission and shall serve as its legal advisor and secretary. (Ord. 15429 §1; February 12, 1990: P.C. §2.80.010: Ord. 11084 §1; May 6, 1974).

4.04.020 Duties; Public Meetings.

The Charter Revision Commission is charged with the duty and responsibility to make recommendations to the Mayor and City Council with regard to revisions to the Home Rule Charter of the City of Lincoln which it shall deem advisable. The commission shall conduct at least one public meeting semiannually for the purpose of receiving recommendations from the public regarding revisions to the Charter and to take action upon any matters before the commission relating to proposed Charter revisions. 4.04.030 Officers and Rules.

The commission shall elect a chairperson vice-chairperson, and such other officers as it shall deem necessary to serve for such terms as it shall prescribe. The commission shall also adopt formal written rules for the conduct of its business and proceedings. (Ord. 15429 §3; February 12, 1990: P.C. §2.80.030: Ord. 11084 §3; May 6, 1974).
