REASON FOR LEGISLATION

Approving the City's intent to disestablish the West Haymarket/Downtown Core Management Business Improvement District, the boundaries of which generally extend along the exterior lines of Pinnacle Arena Drive on the west and north, North 8th Street and North 9th Street on the east, and O and N Streets on the south, effective August 31, 2016. This is the first step to be taken in order to consolidate this area into the proposed new Downtown Core Management Business Improvement District which is being created to replace the existing Core Management Business Improvement District which expires on August 31, 2016.

DISCUSSION / FINDINGS OF FACT:

The existing Downtown Management and Core Management Business Improvement Districts (BID's) will sunset on August 31, 2016. Steps are underway to recreate the two districts. When the districts are recreated, we plan to combine the area within each district with the corresponding areas of the West Haymarket Management and Core Management Districts which are being disestablished. In order to combine the four districts into two districts, we must first pass resolutions of intent to disestablish the West Haymarket Districts. These resolutions of intent will then be followed by the adoption of ordinances which actually disestablish the districts. Once the two West Haymarket Districts are disestablished, the City will then request an ordinance to establish two new districts. The result will be two management districts serving downtown rather than four.
