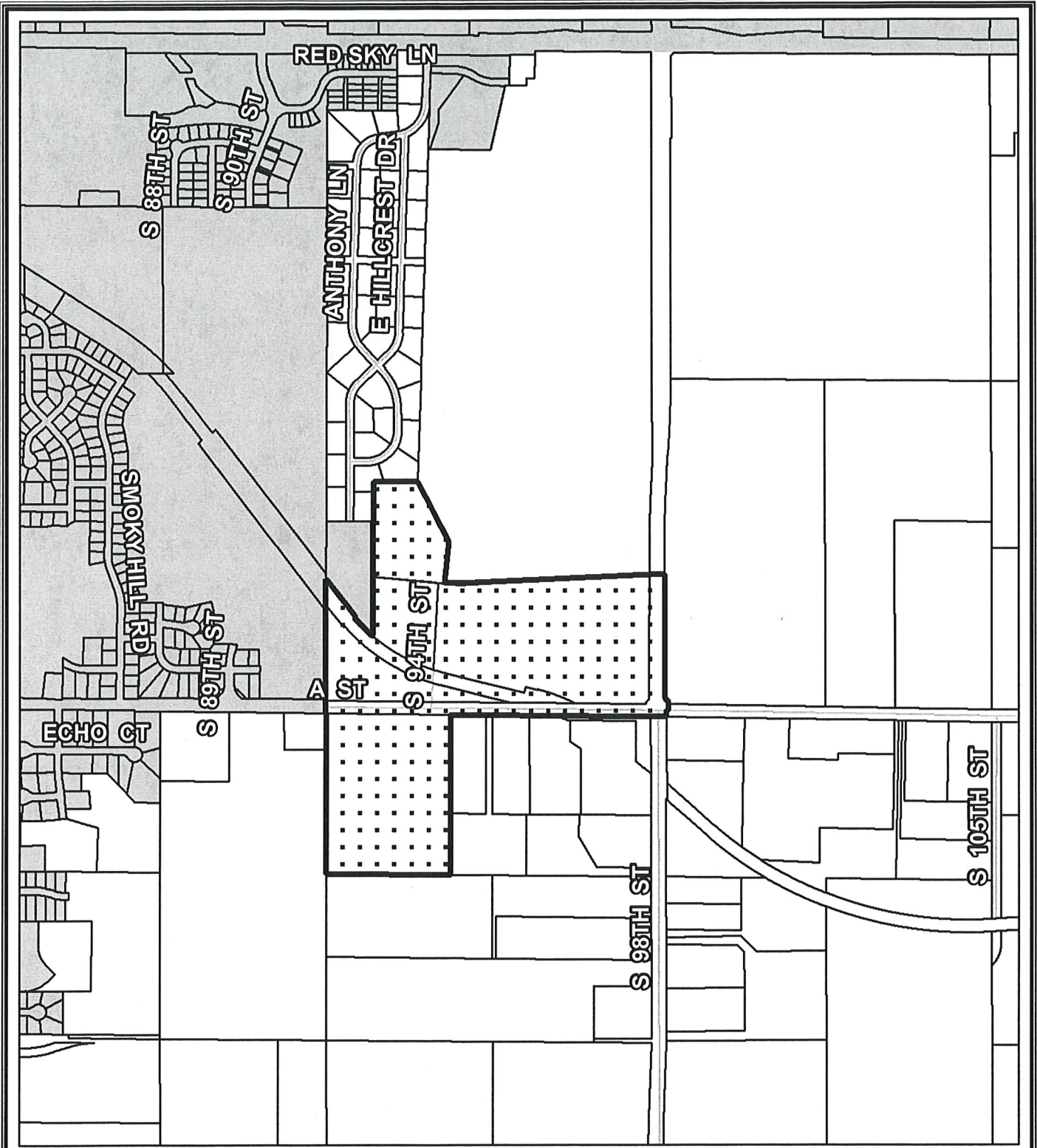

1. Annexation Map - South 93rd Street and "A" Street, Effective November 20, 2018

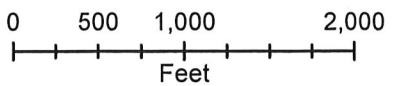

Council members,

The regulation change for card board recycling has helped minimize garage for homes. The city needs to put in a mandate on Garabage companies to only pick up bins or trash on one day.
