

**Amendment to Agreement
Water Treatment Services Program
for the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission
Per Lincoln Public Schools
Proposal No. 7181, dated 07/23/12
First Renewal**

This Amendment is hereby entered into by and between Fremont Industries, 4400 Valley Industrial, Blvd. N., Shakopee, MN 55379-1859 (hereinafter "Contractor") and Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission (hereinafter "PBC"), for the purpose of amending an Agreement dated May 13, 2014, (the "Agreement"), for **Water Treatment Services Program for the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission, Proposal No. 7181, dated 07/23/12**, which is made a part hereof by this reference.

WHEREAS, the original term of the Agreement is upon execution of the contract through August 31, 2014, with the option to renew for additional one (1) year terms on a yearly basis upon written mutual consent of both parties, not to exceed the term of the current Lincoln Public School contract; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to renew the agreement for an additional one (1) year term beginning September 1, 2014 through August 31, 2015 per Lincoln Public School terms (Attachment A); and

WHEREAS, the estimated expenditures for the PBC for the term of this renewal shall not exceed \$20,355.50 without prior approval by the PBC Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual covenants contained in the Contract, under PBC Agreement dated May 13, 2014, and stated herein the parties agree as follows:

- 1) The term of the renewal shall be from September 1, 2014 through August 31, 2015 as per Lincoln Public School terms (Attachment A).
- 2) The estimated expenditures for the PBC for the term of this renewal shall not exceed \$20,355.50 without prior approval by the PBC Board.
- 3) All other terms of the Agreement, not in conflict with this Amendment, shall remain in full force and effect.




THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into by and between **Fremont Industries, Inc., 4400 Valley Industrial Blvd. N, Shakopee, MN 55379-1859** hereinafter called contractor, and the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission, Lincoln, Nebraska.

WHEREAS, Lincoln Municipal Code §2.18.030(c) allows Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission to join with other units of government for cooperative purchasing; and

WHEREAS, the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission through local inter-governmental cooperative purchasing have chosen to participate in the contract between the Lincoln Public Schools and Fremont Industries, Inc., Proposal No. 7181, dated July 23, 2012 for Water Treatment Services which was prepared in accordance with Lincoln Public School's usual and customary laws, procedures and policies, and has approved and adopted said documents connected with said, Work, to-wit:

for all labor, material and equipment necessary to provide Boiler, Cooling Tower and Mechanical Water System Monthly Treatment and Testing for the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commissions Facilities, Location Nos. 1 - 9, in compliance with the prices as established via Lincoln Public Schools, Proposal No. 7181, dated July 23, 2012 for Water Treatment Services; and,

WHEREAS, the Contractor, in response to the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commissions's request to participate in said agreement, has submitted to the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission, an offer approving Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission's participation under the same pricing structure, terms and conditions as Lincoln Public Schools, Proposal No. 7181, dated July 23, 2012 and Proposal to City of Lincoln Public Building Commission, dated March 21, 2014 - Attachment A for Building Commission Facilities, Location Nos. 1 - 9, with only those exceptions stated herein; and,

WHEREAS, Lincoln Public Schools, in the manner usual and customary to their laws, policies and procedures has opened, read, examined, and canvassed the Proposals submitted in response to the proposal request, and as a result of such canvass has determined and declared the Contractor to be the lowest responsible bidder for the said Work for the sum or sums named in Lincoln Public Schools, Proposal No. 7181, dated July 23, 2012 and Proposal to City of Lincoln Public Building Commission, dated March 21, 2014 - Attachment A for Building Commission Facilities, Location Nos. 1 -9, a copy thereof being attached to and made a part of this Contract;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the sums to be paid to the Contractor and the mutual covenants herein contained, the Contractor and the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission hereby agree as follows:

1. The Contractor agrees to (a) furnish all tools, equipment, supplies, superintendence, transportation, and other accessories, services, and facilities necessary to provide Water Treatment Services to Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission Facilities, Location Nos. 1 - 9.
2. TERM OF THE AGREEMENT: This term of this contract is for a period beginning upon execution of this contract through August 31, 2014.
 - 2.1 Upon conclusion of the initial term, the contract may be renewed on a yearly basis with mutual written agreement by both parties for additional one-year terms, not to exceed the term of the current Lincoln Public School contract.
 - 2.2 Any renewal of the contract will be under the same terms and conditions as the original agreement.

3. PRICING: Pricing of items will be pursuant to the Proposal to City of Lincoln Public Building Commission, dated March 21, 2014 - Attachment A, Location Nos. 1-9.

- 3.1 Terms of payment shall be net thirty (30) days for all merchandise meeting the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission Specifications and approval.

The Contractor will provide and install all required equipment and provide monthly testing for the duration of the contract. A monthly invoice of \$1,696.25 will be billed to the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission. The total cost of products or services shall not exceed \$10,177.50, during the contract term without approval.

4. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR: It is the express intent of the parties that this contract shall not create an employer-employee relationship. Employees of the Contractor shall not be deemed to be employees of the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission and employees of the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission shall not be deemed to be employees of the Contractor. The Contractor and the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission shall be responsible to their respective employees for all salary and benefits. Neither the Contractor's employees nor the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission employees shall be entitled to any salary, wages, or benefits from the other party, including but not limited to overtime, vacation, retirement benefits, workers' compensation, sick leave or injury leave. Contractor shall also be responsible for maintaining workers' compensation insurance, unemployment insurance for its employees, and for payment of all federal, state, local and any other payroll taxes with respect to its employees' compensation
5. INDEMNIFICATION: The Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission, their agents, officers and employees from and against all claims, demands, suits, actions, payments, liabilities, judgments and expenses (including court-ordered attorneys' fees), arising out of or resulting from the acts or omissions of the Contractor, its principals, officers, agents, or employees in the performance of this contract. Liability includes any claims, damages, losses and expenses arising out of or resulting from the performance of this Contract that results in any claim for damage whatsoever including any bodily injury, civil rights liability, sickness, disease, or damage to or destruction of tangible property including the loss of use resulting therefrom. Further, Contractor shall maintain a policy or policies of insurance (or a self-insurance program), sufficient in coverage and amount to pay any judgments or related expenses from or in conjunction with any such claims. Nothing in this contract shall require either party to indemnify or hold harmless the other party from liability for the negligent or wrongful acts or omissions of said other party or its principals, officers, or employees.
6. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY: In connection with the carrying out of this project, the Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, ancestry, disability, age or marital status. The Contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, national origin, ancestry, disability, age or marital status. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship.

7. Termination. This Contract may be terminated by the following:
- 7.1 Termination for Convenience. The Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission may terminate this Contract upon fourteen (14) days written notice to the Contractor for any reason without penalty to the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission .
 - 7.2 Termination for Cause. The Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission may terminate the Contract if the Contractor:
 - 7.2.1 Refuses or fails to supply the proper labor, materials and equipment necessary to provide services and/or commodities.
 - 7.2.2 Disregards Federal, State or local laws, ordinances, regulations, resolutions or orders.
 - 7.2.3 Otherwise commits a substantial breach or default of any provision of the Contract Document. In the event of a substantial breach or default the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission will provide the Contractor written notice of said breach or default and allow the Contractor ten (10) days from the date of the written notice to cure such breach or default. If said breach or default is not cured within ten (10) days from the date of notice, then the contract shall terminate.
8. The parties agree that the terms and conditions of this Contract shall prevail and govern in the case of any such inconsistent or additional terms in the contract between Lincoln Public School Proposal No. 7181, dated July 23, 2012 and Proposal to City of Lincoln Public Building Commission, dated March 21, 2014 - Attachment A .
9. Insurance. The Contractor shall maintain during the life of this contract the types and amounts of insurance as specified in the "Insurance Requirements for Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission Contracts" attached hereto and incorporated by this reference. The Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission shall be named as additional insured with regard to the performance of the contract services.



B. **FREMONT RESPONSIBILITIES.** Fremont's responsibilities to Purchaser include the following:

1. Fremont shall provide:

All required wet chemistry, service and online service reporting for all locations.

2. Installation of all equipment shall be performed by Purchaser's personnel according to wiring and plumbing diagrams provided by third party equipment manufacturers.

3. Fremont shall provide regular at least MONTHLY testing to determine the need for adjustments in product usage to maintain target levels. Test materials will be provided by Fremont.

4. Fremont SHALL NOT provide Purchaser with the ability to perform 24/7 online monitoring.

5. Fremont shall provide product performance reports at least MONTHLY setting forth test results.

6. Product levels on hand will be checked during regularly scheduled visits and replenished as needed.

C. PURCHASER RESPONSIBILITIES.

1. Except as set forth above, Purchaser shall be responsible for all other water treatment precautions including but not limited to the following:

2. Purchaser shall be responsible for ensuring: (a) that the areas where products sold pursuant to this Statement are held and used are properly secured and ventilated; (b) that all required warnings and other necessary signage is present and properly displayed; (c) that all Purchaser personnel who have access to the area where products are kept are trained regarding the proper handling and disposal of the products, including the use of protective clothing and equipment where applicable; and (d) that all chemicals are properly handled and that protective clothing and equipment is present and available for use at all times.

3. Purchaser shall be responsible for the costs of any parts or equipment.
