



Summer is the Time to Catch Up on Vaccinations!

Many families wait until the school year begins to get their child the required vaccines for school. If you wait until September, there are less choices for appointments with your health care provider and you run the risk of your student missing school because the deadline is past!

In order to help meet this important deadline, this summer, the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department is offering extra appointments during the early evening and on Saturdays. In June, July, and August, we will be open longer on Tuesdays and Thursdays (until 6 p.m.) and will offer Saturday clinics (from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.). **Please call 402-441-8065 for an appointment.** Sorry, we cannot accommodate walk-in patients.

Children eligible for vaccine at the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department are up to 19 years of age and are uninsured, underinsured, covered by Nebraska Medicaid, or are American Indian or Alaskan Native. Children must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian and records of previous vaccines must be presented. Free or reduced cost services are available.
