### Definition

“Livestock Feeding Operation” shall mean a location where beef cattle, dairy cattle, horses, swine, sheep, poultry, or other livestock have been, are, or will be stabled or confined and fed or maintained for a total of 45 days or more in any 12 month period and is defined as a medium or large “Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation” by Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality. Livestock Feeding Operation does not include aquaculture.

### Special Permit

Livestock Feeding Operation (LFO) may be allowed by special permit in the AG District under the following conditions:

1. A site plan showing the location and distance from lot lines of all confined areas, compost areas, and accessory buildings used as part of the Livestock Feeding Operations.
2. A letter from Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality (NDEQ) stating if the facility requires a Construction and Operating Permit.
3. A construction and Operating Permit (if required) shall be approved by NDEQ prior to any building permits.
4. If required by Lancaster County Engineer, a road maintenance agreement. The road maintenance agreement shall be required prior to any building permits.
5. A siting matrix with minimum score of \_\_\_\_
