CONSTRUCTION OVERVIEW

The Lincoln on the Move quarter-cent sales tax is investing in improvements to 14th Street from Yankee Hill Road to Pine Lake Road. These improvements include removal and replacement of deteriorated concrete street paving sections, concrete median, curb repair or replacement, joint and crack sealing, pavement markings and inlet top replacements. Additional work with other funding sources includes upgrades to the existing curb ramps to comply with the Federal Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements.

The Lincoln on the Move quarter-cent sales tax is a six-year program that is investing more than \$96 million into Lincoln's streets. For more information, go to lincoln.ne.gov/projects.

ACCESS DURING CONSTRUCTION

The project will require lane closures and left-turn restrictions. Traffic will be shifted as needed to accommodate work. One lane of traffic will remain open in each direction at all times. Sidewalk closures will be necessary for curb ramp reconstruction.
