

### Q1 How often do you use Wilderness Park trails? (choose one)





### Q2 When you do use Wilderness Park trails, how are you most likely to use them? (pick up to three)





## Q3 How much time are you likely to spend in the park during a typical visit? (choose one)





## Q4 How are you most likely to access the trails in Wilderness Park? (choose one, fill in "other")















#### Q10 How do you currently navigate Wilderness Park trails? (choose one)








