

## TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENTS

*The Lincoln MPO oversees transportation planning in Lincoln and Lancaster County. One of the documents used for this purpose is the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).*

The [TIP](#) is a program of transportation projects that will be implemented during the next four years.

A new TIP is adopted annually. It contains information on a wide range of transportation projects including pedestrian and bicycle facilities, roads, bridges, highways and interstates, trails, bus system operations and improvements, airport and railroad safety projects, and transportation planning efforts.

The [Proposed Fiscal Years 2025-2028 TIP](#) was adopted by the MPO Officials Committee on May 17.

*Several major transportation projects from the TIP were completed during the past year:*

- N-2 – Lincoln South Beltway
- US-77: I-80 to Warlick Blvd (*Mill and Overlay*)
- US-77: Princeton – N-33 (*Resurfacing and Bridge Repair*)
- I-80 from I-180, northeast to 27th Street (*Barriers and Bridge Rails*)
- North 27th Street Adaptive Signal Control (*Safety Project*)
- Standardize Integrated E-Construction (*Standardized the City of Lincoln's Integrated e-Construction to Automate Project Delivery*)

*The TIP reflects upcoming transportation projects and spending.*

## REQUEST A BIKE RACK

A bike rack request program operated by the City of Lincoln's Complete Streets program offers businesses and property owners in Lincoln a free bike rack when a demonstrated need is shown. The bike racks support the use of active modes of transportation in Lincoln, reducing emissions and increasing public health to meet city goals.

Bike racks are available as funding allows and it must be determined that there is adequate space for the rack(s) without compromising access or pedestrian areas.

With the program's kickoff, numerous bike racks were requested and are currently being reviewed at locations such as businesses and nonprofits.

The Complete Streets program was launched in September 2013 to accommodate all modes of transportation in the design of public and private streets in Lincoln.
