Kim will be discussing prioritizing ideas to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in Lincoln. In 2021, the City of Lincoln adopted a Climate Action Plan intended to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 80% by 2050. The City is currently engaging Lincoln residents to help identify priority measures within the Plan. Feedback from residents gathered from surveys and meetings will help the City create a Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP) that identifies near-term actions and policies that can be implemented to reduce emissions. Creating a PCAP will qualify the City for federal funding to implement strategies outlined in the 2021 Climate Action Plan.
