  - **Zoning Text Amendment: Expanding Access to Local Produce** – Andrew Thierolf, Planning Department  
This proposal would make it easier for residents to grow and purchase local produce within their neighborhood, increasing access to healthy food. The only types of crop-based agriculture currently allowed in residential zoning districts are community gardens and accessory home gardens. With this proposal, vacant residential lots could be used for individually owned urban gardens and limited on-site sales would also be allowed.

The City of Lincoln started a new heat pump incentive program in January 2024 in partnership with Lincoln Electric System.
